### Legal Update Week 17 - 18 (26 April – 8 May 2021)

Thailand legal news

8 May 2021:

#### Highlights:

- A new economic stimulus package "Ying Chai Ying Dai" scheme

- New Notifications on Criteria, Methods and Conditions Relating to the Electronic Court Procedures during COVID-19 pandemic

- Min Reg. re: Write-off for more than THB 2 Mio debt

- The government announced the new plan that vaccinated tourists to Thailand's capital Bangkok and top tourist destinations will be exempted from the country's mandatory quarantine from 1 October 2021 onwards.
- The government launched a new economic stimulus package "Ying Chai Ying Dai" ("the more you spend, the more you get") aiming for the persons with high buying potential (approx. 4 million persons) to increase the expenditure by approx. THB 400 billion. This new scheme offers cashback e-vouchers to participants between July and September 2021 for buying food, goods, and services with the cashback in return at a rate of 10-15% of expenditures (or approx. THB 5,000 7,000 per day).
- The government confirmed to reopen Phuket for foreign tourists who have been vaccinated without any Covid-19 quarantine on 1 July 2021 and this would later be extended to cover Krabi, Phangnga, Surat Thani, Chiang Mai, Chon Buri, Buri Ram, Phetchaburi, Prachuap Khiri Khan, and Bangkok.

#### • <u>5 May 2021:</u>

- The BOI announced that the applications for the investment promotion in the first quarter of 2021 increased by 80%, worth THB 123.4 billion of investment. The ventures in the medical and electric & electronics (E&E) sectors are leading the way, while foreign direct investment (FDI) applications more than doubled.

#### • <u>3 May 2021:</u>

• The opening of new cryptocurrency accounts will require the customer's identity verification, via a "dipchip" machine obligating to be physically present. This measure starts from September 2021 as announced by the Anti-Money Laundering Office.

#### New Cabinet resolutions

#### • <u>5 May 2021</u>

- <u>Approved Draft</u>: Draft Royal Decree re: tax exemption (Issue no. ...) B.E. ... (tax measure to subsidize the employment of ex-prisoners):
  - Defines the term "ex-prisoner" as the Thai prisoners who were released from the prison due to the completion of jail term, reduction of jail term, or parole.
  - Exempts 50% (not more than THB 15,000) of the salary for the CIT for a company or juristic person who employs the person who was released from the prison not more than 3 years after the date of release.
- <u>Approved principle:</u> Draft Ministerial Regulation defining the load, resistance, and durability of the building as well as the character and qualifications of materials used in accordance with the building control law, B.E. ...:
  - Provides definitions in accordance with current engineering technology and theory and clearly defines building safety in matters and determines the calculation

method to be updated and comply with the universal standard.

- Determines the calculation of the parts of the building that consist of wood materials, structural steel, brick, or concrete blocks etc. by using the force unit.
- •<u>Approved Draft</u>: Draft Royal Decree under the Revenue Code Regarding Tax Exemption (No. ...) B.E. ... (tax measures to support donations for vaccine provision):
  - Determines that any individuals who donate to the National Vaccine Institute can utilize the tax deduction as an amount donated but after combination with the amount of donations under Section 47 (7) under the Revenue Code, it must not exceed 10% of the assessable income;
  - The company or juristic partner which donates money or assets to the National Vaccine Institute can deduct the expense for the tax calculation as the actual amount of donation but when combined with expenditures for public charities or for public use under Section 65 Ter (3) (kor) of the Revenue Code, it must not exceed 2% of the net profit;
  - Donations according to the abovementioned must be donated through the electronic donation system (e-Donation) of the Revenue Department from 1 January 2021 to 31 December 2023.
- •<u>Approved principle</u>: Measures to mitigate impacts on citizens and business operators from the outbreak of Covid-2019 of April 2021:
  - <u>COVID-19 credit measure</u>: Provides loans for the people to alleviate the suffering for those affected by the COVID-19 crisis such as employees, self-employed, small entrepreneurs, etc., through the Government Savings Bank and Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives, for the total credit line of THB 20 billion, with a fixed interest (flat-rate) not more than 0.35% per month, the loan term of not more than 3 years (without the repayment of principal and interest for the first 6 installments);

- <u>Debt suspension by commercial banks</u>: This is for Specialized Financial Institutions (SFIs) to extend the grace period for retail customers until 31 December 2021, on a voluntary basis;
- <u>Measures to alleviate the burden of basic utilities</u> (electricity and water supply): by providing discount for electricity and water bills. This measure was implemented from May to June 2021.
- <u>Measures to relieve expenses in an urgency:</u> injecting more financial assistances via the Rao Chana, Khonrakeung, and Section 33 We Love schemes.

#### • <u>27 April 2021:</u>

- <u>Approved Draft:</u> Draft Notification re: determination of the authorities of the Ministers under the laws to become the authorities of the Prime Minister:
  - Transfers the authorized power of the Ministers to the Prime Minister temporarily under the 31 prescribed laws and regulations in relation to preventing the spread of Covid-19, reducing the effects, and providing aids to the public.
- <u>Approved Draft</u>: Notification of the Ministry of Public Health re: criteria, measures, and requirements of determination of expense for the procession of emergency patients from the dangerous communicable disease under the communicable disease laws for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) (Issue no. 3):
  - Amends the definition of "patient" and "expense" to cover the patients who face the vaccine allergy or any undesirable effects after receiving the vaccine for preventing Covid-19 from the governmental hospital;
  - Increases the cost of transportation allowance and price for medical equipment, i.e. Personal Protective Equipment: (PPE).
